
## Central City School Needs Assessment, 2020




I believe health is just so so. Some things do not conform.

Working on tablets and computers helps kids a lot for their future


Most of the junior high classes have barely used technology for anything this school year.

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
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Craft Night and Crazy Cultural Night are both Title I parent-involvement events. Do you want to see these events continued for the next school year?

Craft night could be split into 2 nights by grade level. It is always over crowded.




