# Fine Arts Word Hunt

Read the paragraphs below.

People are often a little bewildered by the strange magic-wand movements of an orchestra conductor. The audience can see that the conductor is enthusiastic and has been classically trained. It's more difficult to understand what specific instruction the conductor's baton is telling each musician.

The audience can see that the conductor's mechanical up-and-down movements are keeping the beat. But the smaller, more artistic movements are sometimes difficult to understand. These small movements are signals to particular sections of the orchestra. The conductor may be instructing them to play more softly or to build gradually to something louder and more dramatic.

It seems as though orchestra members seldom look at the conductor. Why does the conductor bother to move about so artistically if no one is watching him or her? In actuality, the musicians can see the conductor's basic movements with their side vision, and they have practiced the music many times before. They know specifically when to watch the signals for their own parts.

The orchestra conductor is not teaching the music to the musicians. The conductor's interpretation of the piece shapes the timing. The maestro also maintains the dynamic energy and keeps all the musicians playing together. An energetic conductor may look a little crazy sometimes, but that makes the concert more fun to watch!
