

Technology Word Hunt

The idea of robots is not new. People have been thinking about them for hundreds of years. In fact, 500 years ago an artist, inventor, and visionary named Leonardo da Vinci designed a robot that could stand, sit, and raise its arms.

Robots today are much more sophisticated. Software programs tell them what to do. Electronic sensors and camera "eyes" help them know where and how to move. Microchips of memory help them "remember."

Medical professionals are finding it more and more advisable to use robots in healthcare settings. There are several advantages to this. Robots can do the same thing over and over and over again, 24 hours a day, and never get bored or tired. Some robots are designed to lift and carry patients. Unlike humans, they can do this without injuring their backs or even perspiring. They are also cleaner than humans. No robot ever sneezed on a coworker.

A nursebot can perform a variety of tasks without supervision. Some nursebots have navigation systems that allow them to move around a hospital or nursing home. They remind patients and residents when to take their medications. They help them get to appointments. They can monitor vital organs and detect when changes in blood pressure and respiration transpire. They can detect when a patient has fallen or collapsed and call for help, making it more likely that a nurse or doctor will be able to revive the patient. They provide a video and audio connection so that doctors and patients can talk even when the doctor is not in the building. They can even help raise a patient's spirits by telling a joke.
