Read the passage below and look for words from commerce.


About 25 percent of girls in developing countries are not in school. This is bad not only for the girls but for their families and their community. Lack of education keeps people poor and hungry and sick. When a girl is poor and uneducated, things get even worse because that girl is more likely to get married and have children. Her children will be poor and uneducated, too, and so the cycle of poverty continues.

This is what can happen instead:

A girl goes to school and learns to read and write. She learns math and science. She has an idea. She gets a microloan to promote her endeavor. She buys a cow. The cow gives her family milk. They are healthier. She sells the extra milk and saves her money and buys another cow. More milk, more income. Eventually she has a small herd. She repays the loan. She asks a sibling to be her assistant. She is now an employer. The business continues to grow. She increases her investment in her family and her community. She makes enough money to feed her family and send her siblings to school. She has learned to negotiate with the men in the village who are starting to understand that girls are valuable. They are working together now in the construction of a well that will provide clean water to the village.

One girl with one chance becomes an agent of change for a whole village. This is what *can* happen and what *is* happening in villages around the world. It's called "the girl effect."
