Writing an Editorial

PREWRITING

What is the best way to stay healthy? Should everyone exercise? Should they eat certain foods? A good way to express your opinions is to write an editorial for a school or class newspaper. You can find books about being healthy at the library. You can also find information on Internet sites such as Kids Health (www.kidshealth.org). As you think about this topic, make an outline.

DRAFTING

Use your outline to write an editorial. Begin with a topic sentence that presents the main idea. Follow your outline as you write supporting sentences. Make sure to give several reasons to support your opinion. Use as many spelling words as possible.

REVISING

When you have finished your first draft, read your editorial from beginning to end. Check to see if you have included all of the points in your outline. Did you achieve your purpose for writing? Does each sentence support the topic?

EDITING

Use the editing checklist to proofread your editorial. Be sure to use proofreading marks when you make corrections. Circle any words you are unsure about and check their spellings in a print or online dictionary. Now write your final draft.

PUBLISHING

Make a copy of your editorial and share it with your readers. You can also have it published in your school or class newspaper.
